John Page is a Senior Fellow in the Global Economy and Development Program at the Brookings Institution in Washington, DC and Non-resident Senior Fellow at UNU-WIDER, Helsinki. He is a Research Associate of the Center for the Study of African Economies at Oxford University and Adjunct Professor at the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies, Tokyo. From 1980 to 2008 Dr. Page was on the staff of World Bank where his senior positions included: Director, Poverty Reduction, Director, Economic Policy, Chief Economist and Director, Middle East and North Africa and Chief Economist, Africa. Prior to his appointment at the World Bank, he taught at Stanford and Princeton Universities. John Page obtained his BA in economics from Stanford University and his Doctorate from Oxford University, where he was a Rhodes Scholar. He has published several books, including *The East Asian Miracle: Economic Growth and Public Policy* (Oxford: 1993), *Breaking in and Moving Up: Industrial Challenges for the Bottom Billion and the Middle Income Countries* (UNIDO: 2009), *Made in Africa: Learning to Compete in Industry* (Brookings Institution Press, 2016) and *The Practice of Industrial Policy* (Oxford, 2017). He is the author of more than 100 published articles on the economics of developing countries.



Go Shimada is Associate Professor of Economics, School of International Relations, at the University of Shizuoka, visiting scholar of Columbia University, visiting scholar of JICA Research Institute, and adjunct researcher of Waseda University. Prior to this, Dr. Shimada worked for JICA for more than two decades as Director, Trade and Investment Division, Department of Industrial Development; Special Assistant to the President, Office of the President; and first secretary, Permanent Mission of Japan to the United Nations, New York. He has a PhD from Waseda University and an MA in Economics from the University of Manchester.
