

CONFERENCE CONCEPT NOTE

The Global Development Conference is the Global Development Network's (GDN) flagship event, held in a different region and on a different theme each year. It hosts high-level, inclusive, evidence-based debates on current development challenges and priorities, with most participants from low- and middle-income countries (LMICs), which is its trademark. This event provides promising and established researchers with an opportunity to disseminate their work, share their ideas, and foment Global North-South interactions between academics and policymakers aiming to foster a global network. Moreover, it offers new, Southern perspectives on sustainable development issues mostly debated in high-income countries and reinforces cooperation and development effectiveness.

This event has been reframed to go beyond the traditional conference model and make it **centred on capacity-building and networking activities in informal settings aligned with regional priorities directly connected to the thematic focus of each edition**.

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE 2024

The 2024 Global Development Conference is being structured in an innovative way to transcend traditional plenary formats, prioritizing an immersive capacity-building experience while delving into climate change challenges across diverse contexts. The **Global Synergies: Climate Resilience Strategies for a Sustainable Tomorrow** is envisioned to set the stage for an international convergence of academics, practitioners, and policymakers mainly from the Global South but not exclusively so that there is a debate that considers issues at a global scale.

The 2024 Global Development Conference will take place in Fiji on 26-28 November 2024. It is organized in partnership with the <u>University of the South Pacific</u> and the <u>Government of Fiji</u>.









WHY FIJI AND CLIMATE RESILIENCE STRATEGIES FOR A SUSTAINABLE TOMORROW?

The theme of 'Global Synergies: Climate Resilience Strategies for a Sustainable Tomorrow' was crafted taking into consideration the regional significance of Fiji as an island nation extremely vulnerable to the threat of climate change, and the nation's national priorities and regional initiatives focused on this.

Fiji plays a strong and dynamic role in the collective pursuit of climate resilience, interconnected with similar struggles faced by the wider Global South. The conference aims to highlight this through a strong collaboration between the Global Development Network and the Government of Fiji, a leader and particularly affected country in the region.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDGS)

The conference theme aligns with <u>Fiji's commitment to achieving the Sustainable</u> <u>Development Goals</u>, particularly Goal 13 on Climate Action. By fostering global synergies, the event aims to contribute to the broader agenda of achieving sustainable development, recognising the interconnectedness of environmental, social, and economic goals.

COMMON REGIONAL CHALLENGES

Recognising commonalities in climate-related challenges across the Pacific region, Fiji is a strong representative of the region. The nation advocates for regional collaboration in addressing issues like sea-level rise, extreme weather events, and ecological threats, aligning with regional efforts such as the <u>Pacific Islands Framework for Action on Climate</u> <u>Change</u> (2006-2015) and the <u>Pacific Climate Change Migration and Human Security</u> (<u>PCCMHS</u>) <u>Programme</u> currently entering its Phase II.

FIJI'S REGIONAL CONTRIBUTIONS

Fiji has made considerable contributions to regional initiatives such as the <u>Pacific Islands</u> <u>Development Forum</u> (PIDF) and the <u>Pacific Islands Forum Secretariat</u> (PIFS), showcasing its active role in fostering regional partnerships. Conference participants will be encouraged to draw inspiration from Fiji's dedication and experiences.

REGIONAL KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE HUB

The conference will be a knowledge exchange hub at the regional level, highlighting initiatives such as the <u>Pacific Regional Environment Programme</u> (SPREP) and enabling a robust exchange of ideas and best practices to fortify regional climate resilience.









GLOBAL SOUTH SOLIDARITY

Fiji is highly capable of strengthening the nexus for Global South solidarity by recognising shared climate challenges faced by countries in this region. It draws parallels with initiatives such as the <u>Association of Southeast Asian Nations</u> (ASEAN) and the <u>South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation</u> (SAARC), that emphases the strength of collaborative efforts within the Global South.

REGIONAL POLICY LANDSCAPE

Fiji's <u>Climate Change Act</u> and other regional policies provide a contextual backdrop for understanding the regulatory landscape. The theme of the conference calls for harmonizing regional efforts with government-led initiatives, ensuring a cohesive and impactful approach to climate resilience.

By focusing on regional collaboration to address the challenges of the Global South, the conference aims to create a space where participants can collectively explore solutions that transcend borders. Fiji's role as a co-host serves as a focal point for regional discussions, fostering collaboration that extends beyond the conference's geographical boundaries.
