

	Encouraging	Hindering
INGOs & Donors	 Continued interest in the country Main funders of SSR 	 Research is heavily influenced by their shifting interests Funding subject to project lifetime Call for proposals seek an answer, and give the premise
CSOs & Research institutes	Policy research allows closer engagement with policymakersStrong advocacy focus	 Wholly dependent on donor funding Research projects are numerous but isolated
Private Sector	Highly interested in the country	Focuses on marketable topics
Government	 Regional Governments increasingly relying on evidence-based research to tackle social issues 	 No nationwide research strategy or policy Low trust in researchers Emphasis on STEM, ignoring social sciences
HEIs	 Growing research interest National Education Strategic Plan supports reform 	 Insufficient research funding Absence of research culture Academic isolation

QUALITY OF SSR


BARRIERS ACADEMIC RESEARCHERS



- Restrictions to academic freedom
- Sensitive research is scrutinized
- Lack of resources
- Low research capacity
- No national research body/policy
- Low funding for HEIs



ENGAGEMENT OF SSR KEYPLAYERS

PROCEDURES AND ACTIONS

- 90% of non-academic researchers reported frequent interactions with policymakers (vs 50% academics)
- Informal channels
- Social media reliance

Donor

- Funding shapes agenda
- Over-research of hot topics
- Uncoordinated

Gov

- STEM focus
- Low uptake
- HEIs underfunded

Academic Researchers

- Low capacity & exchange
- Academic Isolation
- Poor career prospects

Non-academic Researchers

- CSO/RIs are donor dependent
- Private sector: donor-funded products not accessible

COOPERATION OF SSR KEYPLAYERS

ACTIONS FOR SSR IMPROVEMENT

Gov

- Increase HEI funding for SSR
- Promote culture of academic research
- Establish research body/policy

Donors

- Allocate operational funds for RIs
- Coordinate research projects among donors thematically
- Allow for solution-oriented projects
